



Lighthouse Foundation

The aims of the Lighthouse Foundation are to care for and qive support to disadvantaged children and teenagers, within a safe, loving

family environment. The children are also guided into personal growth programs, which encourage them to take responsibility for their own lives. The group was formed to support Susan Barton who has worked tirelessly in this area for over 16 years. The second Lighthouse is starting in 1991.

808

808, otherwise known as the Doncaster and Templestowe Youth Resource Centre, provides a wide range of sevices to youth in the area. The centre provides accommodation to homeless youth. counselling, personal development courses as well as a variety of recreation, holiday and entertainment activities for all young people in the area, including those with disabilities.

Groups Supported

Kairos Housing Project

The Kairos Housing Project has established supported accommodation to young people aged 15-24 in the Lamberwell area. The programme is focused specifically on maintaining youth in the education system that may otherwise be lost due to unsuitable circumstances. Thiis is achieved by providing housing to those in need, safe shelter to those at risk and dispensing support to young people so they develop their own independent living skills and self-worth in a stable home environment.

S.E.E.K.

S.E.E.K. was designed to find the most innovative and creative ways of making learning easy. The aim of the group is to give children and teenagers lite skills and success strategies for increased academic and personal performance. The group operates regular programmes in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and New Zealand.

Worawa Aboriginal College

Worawa College is the first and only registered Aboriginal independent secondary school in Victoria. The college's underlying education philosophy is based on elements of both traditiondl Aboriginal and current Western education. The college aims to shape Aboriginal persons proud of both their cultural traditions and identity, and who have the ability to contribute effectively to the community at large.

Alma Doepel

Alma Doepel is a three masted schooner which has been restored by volunteers in order to give young people the opportunity to learn the rigours of sailing a tall ship. The nine day voyage is designed to instill confidence in the participants by involving them in shared decision making which will effect the group as a whole and to realise their own self-worth through their ability to deal with others. The Alma Doepel celebrated her 90th birthday on October 10 1993.

Discovery

Discovery is a seven day residential adventure offering practical life skills in relationships. communication, education and life understanding. It aims to assist young people to learn more effectively, engender self-esteem and fosters the development of leadership skills.

Groups Supported

Breaking the Cycle

Breaking The Cycle is an organisarion which conducrs programmes for unemployed and/or homeless youth between the ages of 15-21. The programme involves a wilder ness challenge to build self-esteem and teamwork, educational training to promote a positive attitude to work and life, and business training to gain constructive experience in the workplace and employer pletcement support. The basic aim of the programme is to "break the cycle" of welfare dependence and to pro vide young people with the necessary skills to enable them to fulfil their potential.

Warrandyte Youth Services

Warrandyte Youth Services is a youth organisation which provides a range of services to local youth at risk. They assist in the development of these young people by enabling them to take control of their own lives and creating their own opportunities.

Big Brothers | Big Sisters

The Big Brother/Big Sister program is based on the ongoing friendship between an adult and a young person. The "little brothers" and "llttle sisters" are 7-16 year old youth whose situation in life indicates the need for additional adult support. The "big brothers" and "big sisters" are adults from all fields of life, who seek to support their "match" by providing a range of everyday activities for them to share and by encouraging and taking an interest in their individual welfare.
